

## *Index to Ariail Family Photos*

1. **Ariail Photo1** – James Claudius Ariail and his wife Vastie Bellamy. James was the son of James Leland Ariail and Lettie Meticia Duncan. He was born on Jul 7, 1881, in Stranges District, Franklin County, Georgia and died 21 Mar 1970. He and Vastie were the parents of 12 children, 11 boys and 1 girl. Two of the boys died as infants. The Ariail family reunion began as a birthday party for James Claudius Ariail and was originally held in the back yard of his home. From the start, this was a very big affair because of the large number of children, spouses and grandchildren who attended. James was a farmer and owned a large farm on the Franklin/Banks County line. His descendants still own and farm the land. The farm was originally purchased by his grandfather, William Harrison Ariail and his wife Mary Adelaide Barr in the 1850's when they moved from South Carolina to Georgia. The original size of the farm was in the vicinity of 650 acres.
2. **Ariail Photo2** – Damie Acena Robinson, wife of William Henry Harrison Ariail. She was born on Dec 4, 1844 and died Jul 9, 1926. Her parents were Samuel Robinson and Louiesa M. Massa. She was the mother of 9 children, and great grandmother to Anne Stuart Ariail, who was Miss Alabama in the 1950's and runner up to Miss America during the same time frame.
3. **Ariail Photo3** – John Franklin Ariail, husband of Gertrude Fletcher Humphrey. He was born on Oct 29, 1867 and died Sep 12, 1960. He was twice married, his first wife died in childbirth with her 5<sup>th</sup> child in 1916. His father was William Henry Harrison Ariail and his mother was Damie Acena Robinson. He moved from South Carolina to Florida and raised his family around the Sanford area.
4. **Ariail Photo4** – Elizabeth Ann Seymour, granddaughter of Lucy Ariail, great granddaughter of Jean-Baptiste Mathias Ariail. She was born Apr 7, 1828 in Stockbridge, Massachusetts and died Jun 10, 1908. She married William Wilshire Coffin in Annapolis, Parke, Indiana and lived out her life there. As you can tell from the dress, she became a Quaker. This picture is not very good, because it was reproduced from a picture in a history book. Elizabeth Ann Seymour Coffin was a well-known and respected lady in the Annapolis, Indiana area. We have letter written by her grandmother, Lucy Ariail, back in the 1850-1860 time frame, and Lucy was very upset that so many of her family had moved so far away from their original home. Lucy was referring to some of these family members, especially those who lived in the south, as secessionists.
5. **Ariail Photo5** – James Madison Reid. He was born May 26, 1826 in South Carolina and died Jan 6, 1906 in Dublin, Texas. He was the son of Stephen C. Reid and Sarah Abigail Barton. He married Sarah Jane Ariail, daughter of John Harvey Ariail, Jr., and Parthenia Blassingame. He fathered 6 children with Sarah Jane Ariail and then she died in 1862. After her death he married Frances Miller and fathered five more children. Sometimes between 1880-1900 he moved to Dublin, Erath, Texas with most of his family from both marriages and lived out the remainder of his life in that area. Today his descendants are spread out across Texas.
6. **Ariail Photo6** – Anne Stuart Ariail Muller on the left and Lorraine Anne Kimball Patterson on the right. Anne Stuart Ariail was Miss Alabama and runner up to Miss America in 1957. She currently lived in California with a home in the Grand Tetons, Wyoming. She was the daughter of Henry Ellis Ariail, Sr. and Marion Stuart Riddle of Birmingham, Alabama. I was a tour bus driver with a group of tourists in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, and Anne was gracious enough to come to our hotel and visit with us for a while. She is a very accomplished, charming and beautiful lady. Everyone should visit her posting on the Internet to learn much more about her work and accomplishments.
7. **Ariail Photo7** – Rev. William Hamilton Ariail, Methodist Minister. He was the son of Luke Ives Ariail and Nancy Lesley. He was born Nov 1, 1851 in Easley, South Carolina and died Oct 9, 1918 in Florence, South Carolina. He was twice married. First to Hattie Elizabeth Yeargen with whom he fathered 4 children. After he death he married Nancy Elizabeth Ozella Daniel with whom he fathered 7 children.
8. **Ariail Photo8** – Nancy Elizabeth Ozella Daniel, wife of Rev. William Hamilton Ariail, #7 above. She was born Mar 9, 1863, d. Jun 1, 1945. She was the daughter of Lemuel Thomas Harrison Daniel. She was the mother of 7 children, fathered by the Rev. William Hamilton Ariail.
9. **Ariail Photo9** – Edouard Quartier, Catholic Priest. This is the grandson of Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail. He was born in St. Denis sur Richelieu, Quebec, Canada on Sep 5, 1796 and died in St. Denis Kamouraska, Quebec, Canada on Jul 17, 1872. His mother was Marie Anne Ariail. He had 16 brothers and sisters and was renown during his time because of his teachings of the Society of the Temperance. The church behind the statue of him was the church he founded and his remains are interred beneath the pulpit of the church. See separate document on the web page concerning the bio for this member of our family.

10. **AriailPhoto10** – Picture of the Catholic Church that Edouard Quertier founded. See #9 above for additional information.
11. **AriailPhoto11** – Picture of Roger and Denise Viau. Denise is descended from Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail. They are part of the Canadian Research team. My wife Lorraine Patterson is also in the picture. I must apologize to the other members of the research team for which I do not have pictures to post on the web site. The picture was taken at their home in Gloucester, Ontario, Canada.
12. **AriailPhoto12** – These are snapshots taken of the hand-painted portraits of Theodore Alfred Ariail. The hand-painted portraits were of their wedding. That is the reason for flash reflections in the pictures. This man is the great grandson of Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail and lived in the Chicago, Illinois area. Some of his descendants are still living there and Glen Ariel, Genevieve Ariel and other members of the family have been to the family reunion. You will note the name changed from Ariail to Arial to Ariel in this line of the family. Theodore Alfred Ariail was born Sep 15, 1852 in Quebec, Canada and died on Aug 23, 1926 in Chicago, Illinois.
13. **AriailPhoto13** – Margaret Caroline Dandurand-Marcheterre is the wife of Theodore Alfred Ariail. She was born on Oct 6, 1851 in Quebec City, Canada and died on Jan 19, 1928 in Chicago, Illinois.
14. **AriailPhoto14** – Margaret Caroline Dandurand-Marcheterre when she was much older.
15. **AriailPhoto15** – Ernest Adelard Ariail, son of Theodore Alfred Ariail in #13 above. He was born Jan 3, 1884, in Chicago, Illinois and died on Apr 13, 1958, in Alameda, California. His wife was named Mary Louise Phauneuf, born Aug 2, 1888 in Lansing, Michigan and died on Mar 4, 1955 in Alameda, California.
16. **AriailPhoto16** – Marie Leda “Ida” Ariail. She is the daughter of Theodore Alfred Ariail #12 above. She was born on 29 Jun 1878 at St. Sauveur, Quebec, Canada. She married Henry H. Kluskens from Holland. She only had one child that we know about that was born in Chicago, Illinois.
17. **AriailPhoto17** – Pearl Ariail. Note: All the Ariail family members in Chicago area spelled the name either “Arial” or “Ariel”. Pearl Ariail, our very beautiful cousin, was the daughter of Arthur Mitchell Ariail and Hannah Harlow.
18. **AriailPhoto18** – Catholic Church in St. Charles, Charlesbourg, Quebec, Canada. Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail first married Marie Louise Allard there on 13 Jul 1761. It is a very quaint but beautiful church and has hanging on its walls pictures of Priests who were there during the time that John Ariail was in the area. John Ariail was in this area from about 1760 until his departure for Massachusetts and Connecticut in 1774.
19. **AriailPhoto19** – This is a picture of one of the Ariail families in Canada. The father and some of the children are missing because there were 12 children in the family. He was 1 generation older than our James Claudius Ariail from the Nails Creek Community and the man for whom the Ariail Reunion first started as a birthday party. His name was Jean Baptiste Ariail and he was 2<sup>nd</sup> cousin 1 time removed from James Claudius Ariail. Now this is whom you see in the picture. From left to right back row: Napoleon Arial, Alphonse Arial, Thomas Arial, middle row: Albert Arial, mother of family Marie Angelique Adeline Pruneau, Daniel Arial, sitting: Jean Baptiste Arial. The father, Jean Baptiste Ariail, not in picture, was born Jul 20, 1842 and died Jun 9, 1886.
20. **AriailPhoto20** – Francois Laurent Ariail and his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife, Sara Carrier. Laurent was twice married, having 12 children by his 2<sup>nd</sup> marriage. He was only married 2 years to his first wife and they had no known children, therefore, she may have died either from disease or in childbirth. Laurent was the grandson of Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail. He was born on Aug 5, 1825 in St. Roch, Quebec, Canada and probably died in Chicago, Illinois. I apologize for the quality of these pictures, but had to get them the best way we could and hopefully they are good enough that we can tell what the early Ariail men look like.
21. **AriailPhoto21** – Theodore Wilfrid “Wilbur” Ariail, son of Theodore Alfred Ariail. He was born Aug 18, 1879, in St. Sauveur, Quebec, Canada. Was a policeman in the city of Chicago, Illinois and died 16 Nov 1918. There were no children in the family. His wife’s name was Florence.
22. **AriailPhoto22** – Marie Louise Virgini “Jennie” Ariail. She was the daughter of Theodore Alfred Ariail and Margaret Caroline Dandurand-Marcheterre. She was born Nov 4, 1890 at St. Louis de France Catholic Church, Chicago, Illinois. This is a wedding picture when she was married on Sep 2, 1913 at St. Mary’s in Bay, Michigan.
23. **AriailPhoto23** – This is a very interesting picture and one of historical significance. From left to right, Lt. Col. Doyce Ariail, President of the Ariail Reunion Association for many years, Virginia Ariail, Effie Leo Ariail and James Patterson, Historian. Lt. Col. Doyce Ariail served his country with pride and distinction for many years. While he was in Vietnam, he lost his 1<sup>st</sup> wife in an automobile accident. By an act of God, all four of his sons survived the accident. Next to him is Virginia Ariail, a very gifted pianist. Then her first cousin, Effie Leo Ariail, who lost her husband while he was in Norfolk, Virginia during World War II. Effie never remarried. Then next is the Historian, James Patterson. He served his country for 20 years in the Navy in the Intelligence Field.

It should be noted that Virginia Ariail and Effie Leo Ariail were 1<sup>st</sup> cousins and did not know of each other until we found Effie Leo Ariail. Virginia was born in 1906 and Effie was born in 1909. At the time they first met, they were 91 and 88 years old. What a touching and wonderful reunion that turned out to be. All three of the persons, Lt. Col. Doyce Ariail, Virginia Ariail, and Effie Leo Ariail have since passed away.

24. **AriailPhoto24** – Nails Creek Baptist Church. This is the church where the Family Reunion is now held. It originally started as a birthday party for James Claudius Ariail approximately 1 mile away at his home. The large cemetery next to the church was originally started when Lemuel Lawrence Ariail died from disease in the Civil War. His father stated that he did not know if they would be able to keep their 600+ acre farm after the war, so they decided not to bury him in a family plot, which was normal procedure during the early times. He instead buried his son in the churchyard, which is now the Church Cemetery. Since the Ariail family was so very large in that area at that time, most of the people buried in the cemetery are either Ariail or related to them in one way or another. The church is located on Georgia RT51 in Banks County, Georgia.
25. **AriailPhoto25** – James Leland Ariail. He was the great grandson of Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail. He was born May 25, 1849 and died Nov 28, 1902. He was the father of 11 children. He had five brothers in the Civil War, 3 died in the war, 1 was wounded at Gettysburgh, Pa., fighting against his cousin, Phineas Dunham and one was a POW in Kentucky. He had one sister, Mary Climelia Ariail whose son lost his life in WWI in the Argonne Forest in France. I realize that this is not the only family who paid a tremendous price in shaping our country, but the family of William Harrison Ariail did their part and we must respect them for their dedication to the cause they chose to support.
26. **AriailPhoto26** – Lorraine Anne Kimball Patterson at the grave of Lucy Ariail. Lucy Ariail was the daughter of Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail and the first Ariail girl born in the United States. She was born Aug 27, 1781.
27. **AriailPhoto27** – I was asked to put some reunion photos on the web page. Here is one and will attempt to fine another or so that is appropriate to post in the short space we have. This picture is of the following: back row, left to right: Cedric Emonides, husband of Karine Ariail, Anne Ariail (red hair) and Fabrice Ariail, brother of Karine Ariail. Front row, left to right: James Patterson, Karine Ariail, Morgan Coakley-our granddaughter, and Lorraine Patterson. Cedric, Karine, Anne and Fabrice are all French and came from St. Nazaire, France to be with us.
28. **AriailPhoto28** – This is a picture of Climelia Abigail Ariail and her husband Lemuel Greenlee Hamilton. Climelia was the first Ariail girl that was born in South Carolina who survived. She had a sister by the name of Elizabeth who died young and is resting beside her father and mother in the Pickens Chapel Cemetery in Slabtown, South Carolina. It is understood that these images were reproduced from etchings on ten plates that had the images of persons on them before there were cameras to catch such images. Climelia was born on Oct 1, 1814 and died Mar 18, 1896, in the Pickensville/Easley area of South Carolina. She was the mother of 7 children, with her son and son-in-law being killed in the Civil War. They were both brought back home and are buried in the family plot in the Old Carmel Presbyterian Churchyard in Easley, South Carolina.
29. **AriailPhoto29** – This is a picture of Thomas Telesphore Ariail and his wife Amanda Monette. I will list the children as born and then list them as they appear in the photograph. This was taken with a digital camera from a paper picture of the family, therefore, the quality is not the best, but we must work with what we have: Keep in mind, they spell the name Ariail.

The picture was taken between 1924-1928. The mother Amanda died in January 1929. In the picture the family is listed as follows:

This is not the largest Ariail family we have on record, but it's the largest that we have a picture of.

30. **AriailPhoto30** – This is a photo of the graves of John Harvey Ariail and his wife Chloe Climelia Ives Ariail. It is believed that the open space to the right of the headstone is the place where Eliza Ariail, their young daughter is buried. When we first started the Cemetery Fund, the first grave that was fixed up was that of John Harvey Ariail and his wife Chloe. Then this year, we have put the coping and crushed stone on the grave to finish it up. John Harvey was born Mar 26, 1775, and died Aug 29, 1836. Chloe was born Abt 1778 and died Feb 14, 1844. They were from Connecticut. We left the fieldstones that originally marked the graves, in place with their initials on them for historical purposes only. The entire cemetery is historical in nature due to it being the final resting place for many Revolutionary War soldiers. Also the Original Aunt Jemima is buried in this cemetery very close to where our ancient grandfather was buried. She was the housekeeper (slave) of General Pickens and lived to be 105 years of age. There is no doubt that we have the correct graves, because of documentation in the Anderson County Library and also a “Westfield marker” in the cemetery that listed the initialed stones as belonging to John Ariail and his wife Chloe.
31. **AriailPhoto31** – Donald Lester Francis Chatfield, b. Sep 22, 1896, d. Oct 18, 1957. He was the 2<sup>nd</sup> great grandson of Lucy Ariail.
32. **AriailPhoto32** – A picture of one of our very beautiful cousins. I will not give her name or birth date to protect her privacy, however, she is the 5<sup>th</sup> great granddaughter of Lucy Ariail. That would make her the 6<sup>th</sup> great granddaughter of Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail and Hannah Rich.
33. **AriailPhoto33** – SGT Enos Beecher Chatfield, husband of Mary Elizabeth Seymour. Mary was the granddaughter of Lucy Ariail. SGT Enos Beecher Chatfield moved his family to Dubuque, Iowa. He was born May 5, 1828 and died Jan 24, 1893. He was the father of 12 children, so you can see there will be Chatfield's all over the place. This picture is of him in his Civil War uniform, and this in itself proves that we had cousins fighting cousins all over the place, some from the North, some from the South. 34. **AriailPhoto34** – Mary Elizabeth Seymour, granddaughter of Lucy Ariail in wedding gown. She was born Nov 14, 1831, in Stockbridge, Massachusetts and died May 20, 1898 in Dubuque, Iowa. She was the mother of 12 children. This is her wedding picture taken about Sep 14, 1851.
35. **AriailPhoto35** – Frederick Seymour Chatfield, great grandson of Lucy Ariail. He is the man to the right with baby touching his face. Frances Elizabeth Riddle is in middle of the picture holding the baby. They are surrounded in the picture by their children and grandchildren. He was born Dec 24, 1853 in Seymour, Connecticut and died Jun 20, 1925, in Bankston, Iowa. He was the father of 11 children. His wife's name was Frances Elizabeth Riddle.
36. **AriailPhoto36** – Joseph Ariail, grandson of John Ariail and Marie Louise Allard from Canada. Joseph Ariail was born on Jul 25, 1813 and died on Nov 4, 1880. He lived in Canada, was married to Judith Belleau-LaRose and was the father of 12 children. Joseph Ariail is the nephew of John Harvey Ariail and his wife Chloe Ives, who came from Connecticut to South Carolina in 1804 and from who most of us in the South are descended.
37. **AriailPhoto37** – Francois Laurent Ariail and his wife Sara Carrier. He is also the nephew of John Harvey Ariail and his wife Chloe Ives. He was the brother to Joseph Ariail (AriailPhoto36), and was born Aug 5, 1852 in Canada. He was the father of 12 children.
38. **AriailPhoto38** – Charles Henry Dunham and wife Cora Estelle Perkins. Charles Henry Dunham was the great grandson of Lucy Ariail. He was born in Plainville, Farmington, Connecticut on Jun 26, 1850 and died in Lakeville, Dakota County, Minnesota on Oct 28, 1942. Cora, his wife, was born Oct 29, 1864 and died Jan 25, 1945 in Rice, Minnesota. They were the parents of 4 children.
39. **AriailPhoto39** – Descendants of Lucy Ariail. I know who they are but for privacy reasons their names and birth dates are withheld. What a beautiful family. I'm sure there are many more such families out there, however, they have not sent me pictures so we can honor them.
40. **AriailPhoto40** – Also descendants of Lucy Ariail. Same stipulations as AriailPhoto39 apply.
41. **AriailPhoto41** – William Boyd Ariail. William Boyd Ariail is the father of the Ariail Family Reunion President, William Keith Ariail. He is also the uncle of The Ariail Family Historian, James Wayne Patterson, who is the son of Lillie Blanche Ariail. He is also the uncle of Betty Jean Ariail Jackson, Secretary of the Association, who is the daughter of Kermit Parks Ariail. William Boyd

Ariail was a veteran of WW II. He served 4 months as a PVT, Field Artillery Basic Training (521); 7 months PVT Gun Crewman, Medium Artillery (864) and 16 months TEC4, Cook (060). His service number 34-971-806, resided at Box 381, Maysville, Banks, Georgia. Date of entry into active service, 8 Mar 1944; date of separation, 4 Jul 1946; date of birth, 6 Feb 1916. Place of separation center, Fort Bragg, N.C. Summary of Military Occupation – Cook. Served as first cook with 178<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery, and 10<sup>th</sup> Port Company in Italy. Prepared, seasoned, cooked and served food for 400 enlisted men. Had also worked in transient consolidation messes feeding 3,000 men. Used gasoline field ranges for cooking. Understood and practices the regulations governing kitchen sanitation. Boyd Ariail completed the 7<sup>th</sup> grade of school in Franklin County, Georgia. His civilian occupation was: Meat Cutter II. Was employed by P H Wright, Commerce, Ga. In a retail grocery store from 1943 to 1944. Butchered carcasses of beef, pork and lamb into small pieces. Used electric powered meat grinder and electric slicer. The late son of William Boyd Ariail, James Thomas Ariail, followed in his fathers' footsteps. He served as a RD2 (E-5) and transferred from the Navy to the Naval Reserve, U.S. NATECHTRACEN, Glynco, Georgia. His Terminal Date of Reserve Obligation was 20 Sep 1967. He received an Honorable discharge and was awarded the Good Conduct Medal for service ending 20 Sep 1965.

42. **AriailPhoto42** – This is a picture of one of the original Ariail Reunions held about 1948 in the backyard of James Claude Ariails' home. I can vividly remember those reunions because of the extreme poverty of most of the people living in the area at that time. We always seemed to have food for the table, but all the items were grown on the farm. Anything not grown on the farm, such as sugar, salt, spices, etc., was purchased utilizing a barter system with peddlers who traveled around from place to place – i.e. the 'Watkins Man'. Mother would make butter, collect eggs, etc., and swap, with the peddler, what she had for the items she needed. You will notice the picnic baskets in the photo that were utilized for the ladies to bring the food in. The well shelter covering the well that grandfather Ariail used to draw water from for his house. The well was approximately 90 feet deep and the water was clear and sweet. Such wells were also utilized as ancient refrigeration for food. Perishable items would be placed into the well bucket and lowered just above the water level in the well. The cool temperatures within the well would help preserve the perishable food until it was eaten by the family at subsequent meals. We never had store bought bread or bananas or any of those things we considered 'good eating' during those days, so when our aunts, Mildred and Imogene came from Atlanta and brought these items, we children gorged ourselves to the point that sometimes we had stomach aches from overeating. It seems sad that we can never go back to those days and re-live the memories that are so deeply engrained into our very heart and soul. Grandfather Ariail had a large family, 12 children. Ten of them lived to maturity, 9 boys and one girl, my mother Lillie Blanche Ariail. So you can understand, with such a large family, the reunion had its beginning as the birthday party for my grandfather, James Claude Ariail and it has continued on an annual basis for over 70 years. After a few years, it was decided to conduct the reunion at Nails Creek Church because it had outgrown the backyard of the home place. These reunions were held behind the church until a fellowship hall was constructed and from that point forward were held in the fellowship hall of the church.
43. **AriailPhoto43** -- Meeting a new cousin. From left to right in picture. Lula Faye Patterson and husband Walter Robinson, Glenda Patterson, Jo-Ann Johnson, Lorraine and James Patterson, and Betty Jean Ariail Jackson. This picture has a family historical setting – Many years ago, there was a man born by the name of James Ives Ariail who married Cornelia DuBose. They had two children named Albert M. Ariail and Marguerite Ariail. The mother Cornelia died in 1918 when the children were very young. James Ives Ariail then married a lady by the name of Hattie Young. When Albert M. Ariail was approximately 14 years of age, he joined the Merchant Marines and was residing in Charleston, South Carolina. In 1935, he and three other seamen went sailing on the Cooper River in Charleston one night. They capsized the boat and signaled for help. The rescue party was on the way to help them, but as fate would have it, another party was signaling for help at the same time. The rescue party went to the aid of the other people requesting help, never knowing that Albert and his party was a 2<sup>nd</sup> distress call. Albert and his companions all drowned. Alberts' father, James Ives Ariail went to Charleston in an attempt to assist in the rescue/recovery efforts for his son and the others who had drowned, but Albert was never found. James Ives Ariail returned to his home and the body of Albert was discovered about 2 weeks later on the banks of the Cooper River by a fisherman. He was buried in the Seaman's section of a cemetery just outside Charleston. Apparently his family never knew that Albert had been found and buried, because his aunt, Effie Leo Ariail Adams told me that they never knew what happened to him when I related what I had found concerning Albert. In 1937, Albert's father, James Ives Ariail died from TB. That left only Marguerite, age 18, as the surviving member of the family. The stepmother, Hattie Young, probably had Marguerite with her, but nobody knew what happened to them. Effie Leo Ariail Adams, half-sister to James Ives Ariail requested that I attempt to find out what had happened to



Marguerite, but unfortunately I never did while she was still living. Well this picture is dedicated to Effie Leo Ariail Adams, because I have finally found the daughter of Marguerite Ariail, Jo-Ann Johnson, (standing sideways in this picture). We were honored to have her attend the reunion this year. It should be noted that Marguerite Ariail also died of TB in Connecticut in 1954. She was only 36 years of age. A picture of her will be included in this section of the web site.

Jane Hurt was born in Greenville, South Carolina on August 15, 1924, and raised in Scottsboro, Alabama, but the impact of her conservation efforts can be seen on the coast of Georgia, her adopted home state. Her work was vital to the protection of the barrier islands and marshes of Georgia, but also instrumental in national conservation legislature as well.

After Jane married Dr. Charles Yarn and settled in Atlanta, she raised three children and was active in local charity work. A trip to the African bush in 1967 sparked her interest in protecting the environment, and when she returned home she spent a year studying preservation issues in Georgia. She was able to lobby against mining on Little Tybee Island, and she focused her energies on protecting the coastal islands and marshes. As a result of her activities, she was asked to serve on the board of the Nature Conservancy in 1969, eventually becoming its first female Vice Chairman. In 1970 she was named Atlanta's Woman of the Year.

Jane was more than just a spokesperson for a cause. She and her husband purchased Egg Island, located in the Altamaha River, in one of the first actions taken to preserve the Georgia coast. Today Egg Island, Little Egg Island and Wolf Island make up the Wolf Island National Wildlife Reserve, which is designated a National Wilderness Area. She also worked to protect other coastal islands, including Ossabaw, Cumberland, Wassaw and St. Catherine's Island.

Jane founded Save Our Vital Environment (SAVE), which was the first full-timer environmental lobbying organization in the state, and which worked to pass the Coastal Marshlands Protection Act in 1970. In the early 1970's, Jane was honored many times for her passionate conservationism. She received the American Motors Conservation Award in 1971, and the same year was named by Harper's Bazaar Magazine as one of the "100 Women in Touch With Our Times."

Jane assisted Jimmy Carter with environmental lobbying when he was governor of Georgia, and after he became President of the United States, he nominated her to serve in Washington as a member of the White House's Council for Environment Quality. It was difficult to spend the week in Washington and see her family only on weekends, but she didn't consider it a sacrifice because she believed so ardently in

her work. She was very proud of her role in the passage of the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act, which was one of the many accomplishments of her three year commitment to the CEQ.

After her service to President Carter, Jane returned to Atlanta and continued to work on environmental issues with a variety of organizations, including The Wilderness Society, The National Wildlife Federation and the Southern Environmental Law Center. She received the national Nature Conservancy Oak Leaf Award in 1989, the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Georgia Environmental Council in 1993, the national Common Cause Public Service Award in 1995, and she served on the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games Environmental Task Force.

Jane Yarn died in 1995 after a long struggle with breast cancer. During her last months, trees were planted in her honor on Lafayette Square across from the White House, and in the Chattahoochee River Park.

In addition to those trees, there is other evidence that Jane Yarn's legacy will continue to inspire all who care about nature's delicate balance. Following her death, Governor Zell Miller dedicated the Jane Hurt Yarn Environmental Education Center at Tallulah Gorge State Park in her honor. The Nature Conservancy gives the Jane Hurt Yarn Award to its Outstanding Conservation Volunteer each year. In August, 2007, the Georgia Department of Natural Resources sank a 63' ship off the Georgia coast as an artificial reef. The ship is the Jane Hurt Yarn, named after the woman who helped designate Gray's Reef, to the east of St. Catherine's Island, a sanctuary. This ship will be a research site to learn more about what creatures attach themselves to the vessel, and whether coral and sponges can inhabit an artificial reef.

It was certainly not a conventional dining room, but I can only imagine that Petrie and her dinner guests must have looked like a million bucks while surrounded by that flattering shade of pink.

319. **AriailPhoto319** – Top and bottom pictures are of the beautiful Au Sable River Valley in Keeseville, New York, near the place where Michel Ariail, son of Jean-Baptiste Mathias Ariail, lived after he came from Canada to the United States. As you can readily see, doing research has its beautiful rewards.
320. **AriailPhoto320** – Left person in both pictures is Glen Alen Ariel, son of Richard Ernest Ariel who lived in Chicago. The other people in the pictures are family members, most likely his son and grandson. Glen attended the family reunion a couple of times and always helped us out with donations to the Ariail Cemetery Committee projects. The ancestors of these family members came down from Canada to Chicago, probably in the mid 1800's and we have been unable to account for what happened to many of them.
321. **AriailPhoto321** – John Harvey Ariail, Sr., came from Connecticut to this very area in South Carolina in 1795. He was working for Harts and Wright from Petersburg, Virginia. His job was apparently buying and selling lots and land for them in a new town called Rockville, South Carolina. Read the historical marker for complete details. John Ariail then got into trouble with his land dealings and attorneys were hired to track him down and resolve the issue. He in the meantime, for reasons unknown, had went back to Connecticut where he married Chloe Climelia Ives and fathered one son. He and his family, along with his brother, Manna Rich Ariail and a cousin of Chloe, came back to South Carolina. John then bought some land and farmed it for the rest of his life. He probably owned a pub and was heavily involved in many of the functions of his community.
322. **AriailPhoto322** – Picture of the Church in Connecticut where the parents of Chloe Climelia Ives, wife of John Harvey Ariail, Sr., are buried. It is the St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Cheshire, Connecticut. One of the Ives family was also Pastor there.
323. **AriailPhoto323** – Top picture is of Janet LouNelson, wife of Robert Beryl Munn and a descendant of Mary Caroline Ariel. The father of Mary Caroline Ariel was Michel Ariail. Michel Ariail was born in Quebec, Canada in 1773, just a few days before his father Jean-Baptiste Mathias Ariail left to avoid being arrested for owing people money there in Quebec. Ironically, Janet Lou Nelson now lives within a mile or two of where her and our ancient grandfather lived the remainder of his life in Southington, Connecticut. The bottom picture, from left to right is of Lorraine Anne Patterson and a Mrs. Bennett from Luzerne, New York. We had originally thought her and her family to be connected with our family, but after an extensive interview with her, we found that not to be so and have deleted all members of that family from the family tree. We wish to extend our thanks to Mrs. Bennett for her help.
324. **AriailPhoto324** – This is a picture of Phineas Leonard Dunham, a descendant of Lucy Ariail from Connecticut. He was serving in the Minnesota Regiment and died in battle at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. See other books of this web site for further bio data and particulars about this member of our family.
325. **AriailPhoto325** – These two pictures of monuments erected to our fallen soldiers at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. The one on the left is the massive monument for the cemetery. The right picture is that of the Minnesota Regiment. When we look at these beautiful monuments which honor our fallen soldiers, we must ponder in our hearts the attitudes of our forefathers as compared to the attitude of many who are reacting to those who protect us today.

It is true that her mother was deceased, but it's obvious that she did not know the whereabouts of her father at the time of her marriage. She thought him to be deceased, but we know that he was living in Connecticut at that time and did not pass away until 1800.

Mary Anne Ariail was the mother of 17 children. Edouard Quartier was child #12 and became a famous Catholic Priest in Canada. See several other documents in the web site pertaining to him. This is being included to show that there was much confusion as to what had happened to Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail when his daughters were marked. As you can see from the marriage document of the sister of this lady, see Photo358, they thought both were deceased, however in this record it shows that Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail was living and Marie Louise

- Allard was deceased. I thought it was important that we document these important facts about the ancestor of our family.

It is the marriage document for Marie Adelaide Terrien, daughter of Marie Louise Ariail and granddaughter of Jean Baptiste Mathias Ariail. She is being married to John Hynes. This is included in this portion of the Ariail Web Site because it contains the signature of her 1<sup>st</sup> cousin, Catholic Priest, Edouard Quertier who is the son of Marie Anne Ariail. Marie Anne Ariail and Marie Louise Ariail were sisters, both daughters of Jean-Baptiste Mathias Ariail. Catholic Priest Edouard Quertier was the famed Catholic Priest in Canada who formed the “Society of The Temperance”. The Catholic Church which he eventually served, upon his death, erected a massive bronze statue of him in front of the Church which still stands to this date. James and Lorraine Patterson, Historians for the family, have visited this statue and payed their respects to their ancient cousin.

It is included for historical purposes because of the following facts. It contains as Godmother, Marie Anne Ariail who is also the grandmother of the child. The man in the picture is holding a Bible and it is said that William Harrison Ariail was at one time a Methodist Minister. (The picture of his wife also has her holding a Bible). 4. The picture is on a 'tin-plate' which comes from an early time. 5. And the most important clue is that we are also in possession of pictures of his sister, Climelia Abigail Ariail and her husband Lemuel Greenlee Hamilton, which were also cast on 'tin-plates'. Therefore, there is little doubt that we have recovered pictures of William Harrison Ariail and his wife Mary Adelaide Barr.
